FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF RESPONSES TO
INTERROGATORIES DBP/USPS-217-237

The United States Postal Service hereby moves that its responses to interrogatories DBPUSPS-217-237, filed on July 7, 2006, be accepted several days late. The delay was caused by the volume of interrogatories filed on this subject, the need to gather information from different sources within the Postal Service and to coordinate responses within and among sets of interrogatories, and the press of other workload and work schedules.
