The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its institutional responses to interrogatories DBP/USPS-103-104. These responses were delayed due to the need to consult with a variety of individuals who are not associated with the rate case. Because employees who are not working directly on the rate case have other priorities, and also because of the tendency of such employees to take summer absences, the Postal Service had a great deal of difficulty collecting the information required to formulate its responses.
