ORDER REQUESTING STATUS REPORT ON POSTAL SERVICE RESPONSE TO
INTERROGATORY OF THE AMERICAN POSTAL WORKERS UNION, AFL-CIO
(APWU/USPS-T1-5)

(Issued November 16, 2007)

On October 5, 2007, Postal Service witness Yorgey responded to American Postal Workers Union, AFL-CIO (APWU) interrogatory APWU/USPS-T1-2 stating that actual end of FY 2007 mail volumes data for Life Line Screening would be available by mid-October.¹ The Response also stated that “the Postal Service can provide this data for the record if requested in follow-up interrogatories.” *Id.* On October 16, 2007, the APWU filed a follow-up interrogatory requesting the Postal Service to provide this data.² Under Commission rule 26(b), a response to this interrogatory was due on October 30, 2007. The Commission seeks an estimate as to when the Postal Service expects to supply a response to this interrogatory.
