UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE
OF RESPONSE TO DAVID POPKIN INTERROGATORY DBP/USPS-48
(March 17, 2006)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance today of the filing of its response to the February 27, 2006 interrogatory of David Popkin. The response was due to have been filed on March 13, 2006, four days ago. The press of business and the unavailability of personnel who needed to be consulted (one has been out of the country tending to a family member's health crisis and the other is out of the office tending a wife and newborn child) prevented a timely filing. The Postal Service regrets the four day delay but considers that no party has been prejudiced by it.
