MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF RESPONSES OF UNITED STATES
POSTAL SERVICE TO INTERROGATORIES OF TIME WARNER INC.,
REDIRECTED FROM WITNESS TAUFIQUE
(TW/USPS-T32-2(b) and 3)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves to file its response to the above-listed interrogatory, filed on June 12, 2006 and due on June 26, 2006, and redirected from witness Taufique. The three business day delay was due to the conflicting demands upon the key personnel who needed to prepare the responses to these interrogatories as well as the responses to POIR 5, filed yesterday. Moreover, material filed in response to the POIR 5 yesterday needed to be developed before an answer to Interrogatory 2(b) could not be provided. Thus the conflict was resolved in the favor of POIR 5.

Whereas no one was prejudiced by the brief delay, the Postal Service respectfully requests that its motion for late acceptance be accepted.
