The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance today of the filing of its objections to the above-listed interrogatories filed on October 18, 2006. The objections were due to have been filed no later than October 25, 2006. Their filing would have been late in any event, given undersigned counsel's preoccupation with the preparation of briefs in Docket No. N2006-1 through October 26, 2006. A breakdown in inter-office communication resulted in both the existence of the interrogatories and the need to file objections not being brought to undersigned counsel's attention until yesterday.
