
Pursuant to Commission rule 27, the Office of the Consumer Advocate requests the Postal Service to make the following admissions. If the Postal Service denies any of the admissions requested below, please identify specifically any statement with which there is disagreement and state the language which the Postal Service believes is required to make the statement true. These admissions relate to interrogatories OCA/USPS-T3-10-11.

1. An Arizona driver's license may have either a physical street address or a post office box address on the face of the license.
2. Arizona residency is not a requirement for the issuance of a valid Arizona driver's license or identification card.



3. Virginia residency is required in order to obtain a Virginia identification card or state driver's license.
4. A post office box address on a Virginia driver's license or state identification card is prohibited except where the population is less than 10,000 and the physical address designation is a post office box or rural route address.
