
PRESIDING OFFICER'S RULING
GRANTING LATE ACCEPTANCE

(February 29, 2000)

On February 25, 2000, the Postal Service filed a motion for late acceptance of responses to interrogatories that were filed one day late. Response of the United States Postal Service to Interrogatories of the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA/USPS-63-64) and Motion for Late Acceptance. The Postal Service cites absence of the individual preparing the responses due to a family emergency and administrative oversight as reasons for the delay in filing. As the Postal Service submits, no party should be prejudiced by this one-day delay. The motion for late acceptance of responses is granted.

RULING

The Postal Service motion included in Response of the United States Postal Service to Interrogatories of the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA/USPS-63-64) and Motion for Late Acceptance is granted.
