PRESIDING OFFICER'S RULING DISMISSING MOTIONS TO COMPEL AS MOOT

(Issued May 24, 2000)

United Parcel Service (UPS) filed the following two motions to compel answers to its interrogatories dealing with city delivery carrier issues: Motion of United Parcel Service to Compel Production of Information Requested in Interrogatories UPS/USPS-T11-25 (Redirected to Witness Raymond), filed April 27, 2000; Motion of United Parcel Service to Compel Production of Information Requested in Interrogatory UPS/USPS-16 and 17, filed May 11, 2000.

Rather than respond to these motions, the Postal Service filed answers to the interrogatories cited. See Response of United States Postal Service Witness Raymond to UPS Interrogatory Redirected from Witness Meehan (UPS/USPS-T11-25), filed April 27, 2000; Response of United States Postal Service to Interrogatories of United Parcel Service (UPS/USPS-16 and 17), filed May 22, 2000.

Because these interrogatories were answered, and there was no further relief requested by UPS, these motions to compel will be dismissed as moot.

**RULING**

The Motion of United Parcel Service to Compel Production of Information Requested in Interrogatories UPS/USPS-T11-25 (Redirected to Witness Raymond), filed April 27, 2000, and the Motion of United Parcel Service to Compel Production of Information Requested in Interrogatory UPS/USPS-16 and 17, filed May 11, 2000, are dismissed as moot.
