The United States Postal Service hereby moves that its responses to the interrogatories of the Office of the Consumer Advocate: OCA/USPS-T4-14 and 19, filed on November 5, 2002, and redirected from witness Wilson, be accepted four business days late. The delay was caused by the development of a full response to Interrogatory 14, which required discussion and coordination among many individuals amid the complexity of the question itself. The response to 19 similarly required consultation with employees who had heavy travel schedules, which impeded the timely preparation of the answers.
