ORDER GRANTING MOTION
FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

(March 15, 2004)

The Postal Service requests a 30-day extension of time, until April 26, 2004, to answer the complaint filed by DigiStamp, Inc. in this proceeding.¹ In support of its request, the Postal Service avers that an extension is needed to enable it to formulate a position on the issues, draft appropriate pleadings, and conduct necessary briefings.² DigiStamp filed a response to the motion, indicating that it did not oppose in principle the Postal Service's request for an extension of time.³

Given DigiStamp's position and the incipient phase of this proceeding, the motion is granted.
