PRESIDING OFFICER'S RULING ON MOTIONS OF AMERICAN BUSINESS MEDIA
FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE

(Issued October 28, 2004)

American Business Media has filed two motions seeking acceptance of certain late-filed documents. Motion for Leave to File Statement of American Business Media Regarding Oral Cross-Examination One Day Late, October 8, 2004; Motion for Leave to File Response of American Business Media to TW et al./ABM-T3-11(b) Two Days Late, October 14, 2004 (ABM Motions). The ABM motions indicate that both late filings were inadvertent and that Time Warner et al. do not oppose the late filing of the interrogatory response.

Given these circumstances and the apparent lack of any harm associated with the late filings, the ABM Motions are granted.

RULING

1. The Motion for Leave to File Statement of American Business Media Regarding Oral Cross-Examination One Day Late, filed October 8, 2004, is granted.
2. The Motion for Leave to File Response of American Business Media to TW et al./ABM-T3-11(b) Two Days Late, filed October 14, 2004, is granted.
