PRESIDING OFFICER'S RULING
GRANTING POSTAL SERVICE MOTION
FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE
OBJECTIONS TO INTERROGATORIES
AND TO RESPOND TO MOTION FOR A
PROTECTIVE ORDER

(May 25, 1999)

The Postal Service has requested a one-day extension of time for filing objections to Complainant's interrogatories and for responding to its accompanying motion for a protective order, citing the voluminous nature of the requests and the need to consult parties both inside and outside the Postal Service. The Service also states that counsel for Complainant has stated that it has no objection to this motion. In light of these considerations, I shall grant the motion of the Postal Service.

RULING
