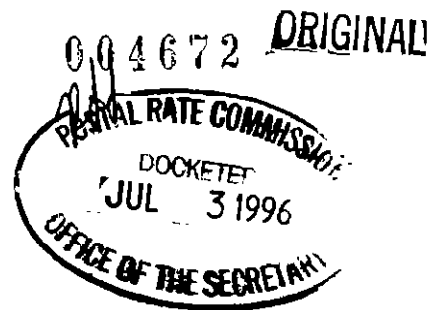

MOTION OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR EXTENSION OF TIME  
TO RESPOND TO INTERROGATORY OCA/USPS-T7-2(A)  
(July 3, 1996)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for extension of time, until July 10, 1996, to respond to interrogatory OCA/USPS-T7-2(a), which was filed by the Office of the Consumer Advocate on June 20, 1996, and is due July 5, 1996. This interrogatory has been redirected from witness Needham to witness Lion, and requires computer runs and the assistance of several individuals to develop a list of ZIP Codes for proposed post office box Fee Group E. Because of the July 4th holiday, and a desire to check the list for accuracy, the Postal Service requests a 3 business-day extension to provide its response, until July 10, 1996. Mr. Ruderman has stated that the Office of the Consumer Advocate does not object to such an extension.


