MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO RESPOND

TO UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE OBJECTION

TO INTERROGATORIES DFC/USPS-1-6

On November 14, 1996, I filed six interrogatories to the Postal Service (DFC/USPS-1-6). On November 25, the Postal Service filed a six-page objection to the interrogatories, lodging both general, procedural objections to all the interrogatories and additional, specific objections to the individual interrogatories. I received the objection by e-mail on the afternoon of Wednesday, November 27, before leaving town for the Thanksgiving weekend. I spent the latter part of the weekend working on an answer to a motion by the OCA and a motion to compel a response to DFC/USPS-T1-1, to which the Postal Service also had objected. I filed both of these documents on December 3.

While my motion to compel responses to DFC/USPS-1-6 is due on December 9, I will be unable to meet this deadline since, regrettably, my regular work schedule limits the amount of time on weekdays that I can devote to my participation in this case. Moreover, I must respond to multiple Postal Service objections.

Therefore, I request an extension to December 13, 1996. I will try, however, to mail my motion as early as December 7 or 9.
