During FY 2019 Quarter 1, there were no offices published in the *Postal Bulletin*, and three (3) additional, previously suspended post offices were re-opened, bringing the remaining suspended total to 247.

During FY 2019 Quarter 2, there were no offices published in the *Postal Bulletin*, and five (5) additional, previously suspended post offices were re-opened, bringing the remaining suspended total to 242.

During FY 2019 Quarter 3, there were no offices published in the *Postal Bulletin*, and three (3) additional, previously suspended post offices were re-opened, bringing the remaining suspended total to 239.

The Postal Service has now reduced the number of suspended offices from the original 662 identified by 423, which represents a 64 percent reduction of the original 662 suspensions. The Postal Service is currently reviewing each of the remaining 239 suspended post offices to determine the proper course of action to be taken.¹

Figures through the end of FY 2019 Quarter 3 are furnished in the attachment.
