PUBLIC REPRESENTATIVE COMMENTS ON  
THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE REQUEST TO ADD  
PRIORITY MAIL EXPRESS, PRIORITY MAIL, AND  
FIRST-CLASS PACKAGE SERVICE  
CONTRACT 67 TO THE COMPETITIVE PRODUCT LIST

(October 29, 2019)

The Commission established the above referenced docket to receive comments from interested persons, including the undersigned Public Representative, on a Postal Service Request to add Priority Mail Express, Priority Mail, and First-Class Package Service Contract 67 to the competitive product list.<sup>1</sup> The Postal Service's Request includes a Statement of Supporting Justification, a certification of compliance with 39 U.S.C. § 3633(a), a copy of Governor's Decision No. 19-1, service contract, and Management Analysis.<sup>2</sup>

The Public Representative has reviewed the contract, and supporting financial model filed under seal that accompanies the Postal Service's Request. Based upon this

review, the Public Representative concludes that Priority Mail Express, Priority Mail, and First-Class Package Service Contract 67 should be added to the competitive product list. In addition, it appears that the instant contract should generate sufficient revenues to cover costs and thereby satisfy the standards of 39 U.S.C. § 3633(a).

The Public Representative respectfully submits the foregoing comments for the Commission's consideration.

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
