ORDER GRANTING MOTION

(Issued October 7, 2020)

The Commission established October 7, 2020 as the deadline for the Postal Service to file its First-Class Mail, Periodicals, and USPS Marketing Mail weekly service performance results, disaggregated by product and service standard, for the period of June 1, 2020, through September 25, 2020, and the corresponding period of Fiscal Year (FY) 2019.<sup>1</sup> The Postal Service requests that the Commission accept the Postal Service's filing of more aggregated results on the established October 7, 2020 deadline and the filing of the complete disaggregated results by October 28, 2020.<sup>2</sup>

First, the Postal Service proposes to file information at the following levels of disaggregation by the established October 7, 2020 deadline:

- Presort First-Class Mail Letters/Flats Combined, disaggregated by Overnight, 2-Day, and 3-5 Day service standards;
- Single-Piece First-Class Mail Letters/Flats Combined, disaggregated by 2-Day and 3-5 Day service standards;
- USPS Marketing Mail Letters/Flats Combined, disaggregated by Destination Sectional Center Facility (DSCF), Destination Network Distribution Center (DNDC), Delivery Distribution Unit (DDU), and End-to-End (Origin) entry type; and
- Periodicals, disaggregated by Destination Entered and End-to-End (Origin) entry type.

Second, the Postal Service seeks that the Commission accept complete disaggregated results filed by October 28, 2020. *See id.* at 1. In support of its request for late acceptance, the Postal Service describes the processes that it would follow to disaggregate results completely and estimates that an additional 3 weeks is needed to complete these processes. *See id.* at 3-4. Given the Postal Service's explanation of its need for additional time and proffer to file some information disaggregated below the class level by the established deadline, the requested relief is reasonable and does not prejudice any party. Therefore, the Motion is granted.

*It is ordered:*

1. The Motion for Further Relief to Submit Complete Response of the United States Postal Service to Revised Commission Information Request No. 3, is granted.
2. The Postal Service shall file the information described in the body of this Order, by October 7, 2020.
3. The Postal Service shall file its complete responses to the Revised Commission Information Request No. 3 by October 28, 2020.
