I adamantly appose the 10 year plan proposed by Postmaster General, Louis DeJoy. These changes would be to the detriment of all who use postal services, including senior citizens and business who rely upon timely, convenient, and efficient services. Closing post offices, reducing or eliminating airmail, cutting back on machinery that processes mail, reducing service hours, and other changes that slow the processing and delivery of mail are simply not acceptable to the public. We need to at a minimum to maintain our current level of postal services and if that means a moderate increase to postal rates or other reasonable means to promote efficiency (and I emphasize reasonable), so be it. Also, we need a change in leadership - leaders who have a keen sense of the needs of customers and who prioritize keeping service levels geared to meet these needs, and who do not have political or self-interest motivations.
