## ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO EXTEND TIME FOR FILING RESPONSE TO CHAIRMAN'S INFORMATION REQUEST NO. 31

(Issued September 30, 2021)

On August 9, 2021, the Postal Service filed the post office suspension report for FY 2021, Quarter 3.<sup>1</sup> To clarify aspects of the FY 2021, Quarter 3 Report, Chairman's Information Request No. 31 was issued on September 15, 2021.<sup>2</sup> The Postal Service responded to questions 1 through 4 of CHIR No. 31 on September 22, 2021.<sup>3</sup> The Postal Service filed an accompanying motion to extend the time for filing responses to

question 5 of CHIR No. 31.<sup>4</sup> It states that "[d]espite its best reasonable efforts, the Postal Service needs additional time to compile this information." Motion at 1. It explains that personnel are working to investigate the background of each suspended post office, recheck the information already submitted, and identify any corrections that may be needed. *Id.* Thus, it requests an extension of 30 days to respond to CHIR No. 31 "to obtain the information necessary to fully and accurately respond to the Commission's request." *Id.* at 1-2. The Postal Service asserts that an extension "is reasonable and will not prejudice any party." *Id.* at 2.

The Motion should not prejudice any party and is therefore granted.

## It is ordered:

- The Motion of the United States Postal Service for Extension of Time to File Response to Commission Requests for Additional Information in Chairman's Information Request No. 31, filed on September 22, 2021, is granted.
- The Postal Service shall file its complete responses to Chairman's Information Request No. 31 by October 22, 2021.
