ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE

(Issued March 15, 2023)

On March 14, 2023, the Postal Service filed a motion for late acceptance of its notice of filing for the Priority Mail—Non-Published Rates 2 customer agreements with serial numbers ending in 1155 and 1156.¹ The Commission requires that such notices be filed with the Commission “within a reasonable time, e.g., 10 days of its effective date....”² Ten days after the effective date of the customer agreements was

March 13, 2023, but the notice was not filed until March 14, 2023.³ The Postal Service states that the delay in filing the notice was due to the unexpected absence of key personnel. Motion at 1. The Postal Service submits that “no party has been materially prejudiced.” *Id.*

It is ordered:

The USPS Motion for Late Acceptance of Notice of Filing PMNPR-2 Contracts with Serial Number Ending: 1155-1156, filed on March 14, 2023, is granted.
