These interrogatories were propounded as part of a larger set to witness Hunter, UPS/USPS-T5-18-26. Responses to other questions in this set were timely filed on March 10, 2000. The responses to interrogatories 18 and 19 required coordination with other postal officials, who had difficulty completing the work required to respond affirmatively with other duties they have been assigned.
