OBJECTION OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE TO INTERROGATORY  
OF THE OFFICE OF THE CONSUMER ADVOCATE TO WITNESS TAYMAN  
(OCA/USPS-T9-43(B))

The United States Postal Service hereby objects to interrogatory OCA/USPS-T9-43(b). This interrogatory seeks "all documents, notes and analysis performed in determining the level of the contingency for the present docket." This question is virtually identical to DMA/USPS-T9-36, to which the Postal Service objected on March 2, 2000, stating: "Any such documents, other than those filed as part of this case, were pre-decisional and would therefore fall under the deliberative process privilege." Similarly, the Postal Service objects to the instant interrogatory on the same grounds.
