MOTION OF THE
ASSOCIATION FOR POSTAL COMMERCE
TO ACCEPT LATE-FILED FOLLOW-UP INTERROGATORY
TO USPS WITNESS CRUM (PostCom/USPS-T-27-7)

Pursuant to Sections 21, 25, and 26 of the rules of practice, the Association for Postal Commerce (PostCom) requests leave to submit a late-filed follow-up interrogatory to USPS witness Crum: PostCom/USPS-T-27-7. PostCom's follow-up interrogatory relates to Witness Crum's response to AAP/USPS-T-27-10, in the further light of Witness Eggleston's subsequently filed response to (1) PSA/USPS-T26-3, which was not filed until March 14, 2000; and (2) to UPS/USPS-T26-19, which was not filed until March 29, 2000 and not received by PostCom until March 30, 2000. PostCom submits that no participant will be prejudiced by accepting this late-filed follow-up interrogatory and, therefore, respectfully requests that Postal Service and its witness provide a response.


