**NOTICE OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
CONCERNING MOTION OF DOUGLAS F. CARLSON MOTION TO COMPEL
THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE TO RESPOND TO DFC/USPS-70,
77(C), 77(D) & 77(F)**

On March 31, 2000, the Postal Service filed an objection to subparts (c), (d), and (f) of interrogatory DFC/USPS—77. On April 10, Douglas F. Carlson filed a Motion to Compel the United States Postal Service to Respond to DFC/USPS-70, 77(c), 77(d), and 77(f). The Postal Service filed an Answer in Opposition with respect to interrogatory DFC/USPS—70 on April 17.

Without prejudice to its right to object to follow-up or related discovery, the Postal Service is today filing responses to subparts (c) and (d) of interrogatory 77, thereby mooted Mr. Carlson's Motion to Compel as it relates to these subparts. The Postal Service maintains its relevance objection to subpart (e) of interrogatory, as stated in its Objection filed on March 31.


