
The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its response to the Motion of United Parcel Service to Compel Production of Information and Documents Requested in Interrogatories UPS/USPS-T10-24 and 32 to Witness Kingsley. The UPS motion was filed on April 11, 2000. The response was due on April 18, making it two days late. This lateness was due to coordination efforts between the Postal Service and the the OIG to obtain information, as well as discussions between the undersigned counsel and counsel for UPS to attempt to resolve the discovery dispute.
