MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF
RESPONSE OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
WITNESS RAYMOND TO ADVO INTERROGATORIES
(ADVO/USPS-T13-60-68, 70-73)
(April 27, 2000)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of the responses of witness Raymond to the following interrogatories of Advo, Inc.:

ADVO/USPS-T13-60-68, 70-73, filed on March 16, 2000. Several factors contributed to the delay in providing these responses. First, witness Raymond has been the target of hundreds of interrogatories in recent weeks, and has also been needed to assist in formulating responses to a number of procedural challenges related to certain of his interrogatory responses, as well as to facilitate and conduct a special technical conference pursuant to Presiding Officer's Ruling No. R2000-1/27. Second, the assistance of other individuals, who are also involved in other aspects of this case, was needed to prepare and review the responses. Finally, the high volume of discovery


requests during this period prevented counsel from immediately reviewing the answers under development.
