
RULING ACCEPTING WITHDRAWAL
OF MOTION TO COMPEL

(Issued May 18, 2000)

On May 16, 2000, United Parcel Service (UPS) filed a notice which, among other things, noted its willingness to accept the documents produced to answer UPS/USPS-T10-24 and 32 in the form proposed by the Postal Service.¹ As a result, UPS indicated that it was withdrawing its motion to compel filed April 11, 2000.² For good cause shown, pursuant to the notice filed by UPS, its Motion is deemed withdrawn.

RULING

The Motion of United Parcel Service to Compel Production of Information and Documents Requested in Interrogatories UPS/USPS-T10-24 and 32 to Witness Kingsley, April 11, 2000, is deemed withdrawn.
