


INTERROGATORIES OF UNITED PARCEL SERVICE TO

UPS/APMU-T1-23. Refer to page 74 of your testimony, APMU-T-1. Confirm that, under your rate proposal, Priority Mail would contribute \$2.343 billion to institutional costs in the Test Year.

UPS/APMU-T1-24. Confirm that, under the Postal Service's rate proposal, Priority Mail would contribute \$2.478 billion to institutional costs in the Test Year (USPS-T-14, Exhibit USPS-14M).
