25 2. NAPUS is a management association, whose dues-paying members include more than 42,000  
26 active and retired postmasters in the United States. NAPUS members derive their livelihood  
27 from their employment with the Postal Service, or receive annuities and health coverage as  
28 a result of prior employment with the Postal Service.


3. NAPUS represents the approximately 28,000 postmasters who manage individual postal

facilities throughout the nation. Moreover, NAPUS members serve as the vital link between postal reliant communities and U.S. postal policy. Actions taken by the Postal Service to alter postal classifications, rates, and fees for special services affect the working conditions of NAPUS members and impact communities in which postmasters serve.

4. NAPUS is particularly attentive to the proposal to change the current fees for post office boxes and the impact that such changes may have on the activity of postmasters and the effect on many rural post offices.

5. Consequently, NAPUS has a strong and statutory interest in the matters to be heard and decided in this proceeding of such nature that its intervention is necessary and appropriate.
