- (c) If the Postal Service's FY2002 and TYAR cost (excluding contingency) and volume forecasts (as well as all underlying forecasting assumptions) come to pass, how much higher would USPS total factor productivity (TFP) be in FY 2002 than in FY 2001?
- (d) Please provide detailed documentation regarding how the Postal Service calculates TFP.
