In developing billing determinants for all classes and subclasses of mail, information is obtained from all available and relevant sources of the most timely data. Depending on the particular circumstances, these sources may include the Domestic RPW sampling system, the Electronic Marketing Reporting System, the PERMIT system which obtains data from mailing statements, special surveys, mailer manifests, and other postal data systems such as support the Address Management System, the Computerized Forwarding System, and other sources of data. The information thus obtained is combined appropriately to develop the full picture of the distribution of volume to weight
