The APWU is recognized as the exclusive collective bargaining representative of postal employees in the clerk, maintenance, and motor vehicle service crafts nationwide, pursuant to 39 U.S.C. §1203, and is certified by the NLRB as the bargaining representative of employees in several non-mail processing units pursuant to the same section of the Act. In accordance with §1206 of the Act, the APWU has entered into successive, nationwide collective bargaining agreements with the United States Postal Service. The proposed changes will have a significant effect on APWU-represented postal workers.

As a clearly interested party, the APWU should be allowed the opportunity to conduct discovery aimed at elucidating the issues, inquiring into the impact of the proposed measures on postal operations, and carrying on the Union's statutory obligation to APWU members to represent them in matters affecting their employment. The APWU affirmatively requests a hearing and affirmatively states its intention to participate actively in such hearing.
