RESPONSE OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE WITNESS KOROMA TO INTERROGATORY OF NEWSPAPER ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA REDIRECTED FROM WITNESS ROTHSCHILD

NAA/USPS-T27-1: Please refer to Page 10, Table 1, of your testimony. Is it possible to calculate, based on this table, whether the Ride-Along product has generated a net revenue increase or net decrease for the Postal Service, taking into account postage from new matter and diversion from other classes of mail? If so, please indicate how such a calculation would be made.

RESPONSE:

It is not possible to determine the precise net revenue effect since such a calculation would involve a number of assumptions, including revenue-per-piece figures for pieces *not* sent. In any event, the net revenue effect is likely to be minimal. For example, projecting the survey results to the universe of Ride-Along pieces and applying some revenue-per-piece assumptions results in an insignificant change in net revenue. Changing the assumptions would not alter this general result. Moreover, net change in contribution would be a more relevant (and higher) figure. Costs are lower with Ride Along, since costs will not be incurred for those pieces that would have been sent as stand-alone Standard Mail.

The attachment shows how a calculation of an estimate of the net revenue effect could be made using data from table 1 of witness Rothschild's testimony.
