The United States Postal Service hereby moves that it be permitted to file the following documents late: its November 26, 2001 objection to DBP/USPS-88, and its November 26, 2001, responses to DBP/USPS-83-87 and 89-91.

The objection was due to have been filed on or before November 15, 2001. Undersigned counsel's attendance to other responsibilities in this docket, not to mention those associated with Docket No. R2001-1, made it impossible to initiate consultations with clients in a timely manner to discuss potential objections. The need to file the objection to DBP/USPS-88 did not become apparent until draft responses were submitted to counsel on the afternoon of November 19th. Even then, the press of other Docket No. C2001-3 and R2001-1 commitments prevented the preparation of an objection until yesterday for filing today.
