RESPONSE OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE WITNESS TAYMAN TO INTERROGATORY OF THE OFFICE OF THE CONSUMER ADVOCATE

ABA&NAPM/USPS-T6-1 – In your response to OCA/USPS-T6-32, you state that, "There have been no TFP calculations made beyond FY 2002." Does this mean that the test year calculations were made with the assumption that Postal Service productivity will not increase in 2003?

RESPONSE:

No. TFP is not an input to the calculation of the revenue requirement. The calculations required to determine the TFP growth implied by the test year estimates have not been done. However, given that test year estimates show little after-rates volume growth, substantial cost reductions, and negative net program growth, an increase in test year productivity is clearly implied.
