MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE TO TEMPORARILY
SUSPEND THE REQUIREMENT TO RESPOND TO OFFICE OF THE
CONSUMER ADVOCATE INTERROGATORIES OCA/USPS-2-8
IN LIGHT OF SETTLEMENT
(June 7, 2002)

On May 29, 2002, the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA) filed certain institutional interrogatories that sought to gather information pertaining to postal special services. OCA/USPS-2-8. Since the filing of those interrogatories, it has become apparent that settlement of the instant proceeding is likely and, therefore, the information sought by the OCA may not be needed to support their direct case. Therefore, the Postal Service moves that the requirement to respond to said interrogatories be temporarily suspended pending the outcome of settlement negotiations. If settlement is not reached, the Postal Service agrees to file timely responses to OCA/USPS-2-8. The OCA supports this motion
