Pursuant to Sections 25 and 26 of the Rules of Practice of the Postal Rate Commission, the American Bankers Association hereby submits this interrogatory and request for production of documents. If the witness to whom an interrogatory is directed is unable to answer the interrogatory or produce the requested documents and another person is able to do so, the interrogatory or request should be referred to such person.

ABA/USPS-T-3-1. In your response to interrogatory OCA/USPS-T3-7, you confirm that the weighted cost per piece for physical returns is \$0.5347.

- (a) What is the corresponding cost per piece for mail that is forwarded?
- (b) Identify and to the extent possible quantify all mail piece characteristics, e.g,

weight, presortation, prebarcoding, shape, *etc.*, which affect the cost per piece of (a) forwarding or (b) physically returning mail.

- (c) How are these costs affected by these characteristics, *e.g.*, how much more does it cost to both (a) forward or (b) return a two-ounce letter compared to a one-ounce letter.


