MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF RESPONSES TO INTERROGATORIES
(April 29, 2004)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves that it be permitted to file late the following interrogatory responses: OCA/USPS-T1-6b, 7a, 9-11 (due April 2, 2004); DFC/USPS-T1-13 and 22 (due April 2, 2004, DFC/USPS-T1-26-30 (due April 15, 2004); and DFC/USPS-T1-31-33 (due April 26, 2004). These interrogatories required consultations with either headquarters or field units (and in some cases both) to determine appropriate responses. At various times since these interrogatories were filed, personnel responsible for either retrieving responsive information or generating or reviewing draft responses have been out of the office on sick leave or pressed by other equally important postal matters. Accordingly, responses could not be compiled until and prepared for filing until today.
