MOTION OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF WITNESS ARNETTA L. COBB
RESPONSE TO INTERROGATORY OF
THE OFFICE OF THE CONSUMER ADVOCATE
(OCA/USPS-T1-32)
(January 10, 2005)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of the response of witness Arnetta L. Cobb to interrogatory OCA/USPS-T1-32, filed on December 20, 2004 by the Office of the Consumer Advocate. This response was initially delayed due to communications difficulties encountered during the recent holidays; it was then further delayed by discussions at the settlement conference of January 6, 2005, at which the Postal Service agreed to revise the proposed treatment of outside First-Class Mail parcels, and committed to producing a table such as that attached to the response to the interrogatory. No participant is prejudiced by the delay, which has permitted the Postal Service to address participants' concerns more directly.
