MOTION OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF WITNESS ARNETTA L. COBB
RESPONSES TO INTERROGATORIES OF DAVID B. POPKIN
(DBP/USPS-T1-49-51)
(January 12, 2005)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of the responses of witness Arnetta L. Cobb to interrogatories DBP/USPS-T1-49-51, filed on December 22, 2004 by David B. Popkin. These responses were delayed due to the fact that communications difficulties encountered during the recent holidays, and Postal Service commitments made during the settlement conference of January 6, 2005,¹ required the Postal Service to focus on interrogatories that were submitted earlier than DBP/USPS-T1-49-51. The Postal Service does not believe that this brief delay has prejudiced any participant in this proceeding.
