MOTION OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF WITNESS ARNETTA L. COBB
RESPONSE TO INTERROGATORY OF DAVID B. POPKIN
(DBP/USPS-T1-39)
(January 26, 2005)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of the response of witness Arnetta L. Cobb to interrogatory DBP/USPS-T1-39, filed on December 20, 2004 by David B. Popkin. In substance, the question inquires into extension or termination of PFS while a customer is physically located at the temporary address. This capability is a practical necessity. An answer to the question was deferred in the vain hope that comprehensive responses could be provided. Such details, however, are unavailable at this time. The Postal Service does not believe that the delay occasioned by further research has prejudiced any participant in this proceeding.
