On February 11, 2005, the United States Postal Service filed a "Motion of United States Postal Service for Late Acceptance of Witness Arnetta L. FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF WITNESS ARNETTA L. COBB'S
RESPONSES TO INTERROGATORIES OF
THE OFFICE OF THE CONSUMER ADVOCATE,
REDIRECTED FROM WITNESS KOROMA (OCA/USPS-T4-23-24)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of the responses of witness Arnetta L. Cobb to interrogatories OCA/USPS-T4-23-24, redirected from witness Koroma and filed on January 27, 2005 by the Office of the Consumer Advocate. These responses were delayed by one day because they required witness Cobb to obtain detailed information from a number of sources within the Postal Service and to get the agreement of all those sources regarding the responses. Postal Service counsel advised the OCA yesterday that this one-day delay would occur. The Postal Service does not believe that this brief delay has prejudiced any participant in this proceeding.
