The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its response to DFC/USPS-6, submitted by Douglas F. Carlson on April 14, 2005. This response was delayed due to the need to identify data sources, and obtain data analysis from parts of the Postal Service not focused on this rate case. Coordination with the response to DFC/USPS-30, also filed today, as well as consultations among the various internal stakeholders could not be completed until today. The Postal Service regrets the delay but believes that no party has been materially prejudiced by it.
