MOTION OF THE POSTAL SERVICE FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE
OF RESPONSES OF WITNESS LEWIS
TO OCA INTERROGATORIES (OCA/USPS-T30-1-7)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of the above interrogatories of the OCA, filed on May 3, 2005: A partial objection to these questions was filed on May 13, and the provision of these answers is not intended to waive those objections. The one day delay in filing the responses was due to the need to coordinate with a variety of operational personnel whose responsibilities require a substantial amount of official travel, but normally do not include involvement in the rate case. The Postal Service submits that no party will be prejudiced by this minor delay, particularly since the Postal Service is still working informally with the OCA on these subject areas.
