MOTION OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE FOR  
ACCEPTANCE OF LATE FILING OF RESPONSES TO  
INTERROGATORIES OF DOUGLAS CARLSON [DFC/USPS-28-29]

The United States Postal Service hereby moves that the Postal Rate Commission accept for filing today the above-listed interrogatory responses which were due to have been filed May 9, 2005. The responses are nine calendar days late. The press of other business delayed the retrieval of information responsive to one interrogatory. Consultations with internal analysts and that were necessary to confirm and explain the absence of responsive information to the other interrogatory could not be completed until yesterday.
