The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its institutional response to interrogatory DFC/USPS-11, filed on April 14, 2005. The response is three weeks late because of the need to obtain data analysis from individuals not primarily working on the rate case, and to review the results for more than one class of mail. Preparation of the response required involvement of a number of postal employees. The Postal Service regrets the delay, but was unable to complete its response until today.
