MOTION FOR LATE ACCEPTANCE OF
RESPONSE OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE
TO INTERROGATORY OF DOUGLAS F. CARLSON (DFC/USPS-14)

The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its institutional response to interrogatory DFC/USPS-14, filed on April 14, 2005. The response is four weeks late because of the complicated nature of the analysis requested in the interrogatory, the need to obtain data analysis from individuals not at Headquarters and not primarily working on the rate case, and the need to further analyze, review, and discuss the resulting data in order to understand them and determine whether they respond to the interrogatory. The Postal Service regrets the delay, but was unable to complete its response until today.
