The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its objection to interrogatory DBP/USPS-90, filed by David Popkin on May 27, 2005. The objection is being filed one day late because of the time it took to identify, obtain, and review the requested Registered Mail training materials, and obtain feedback from interested postal organizations, especially during this period of heavy rate case discovery. The Postal Service regrets the one-day delay, but does not believe that parties will be prejudiced.
