The United States Postal Service hereby moves for late acceptance of its response to the above-listed interrogatory of the Major Mailers Association, filed on May 18, 2005 and due on June 1, 2005. The one week delay is due to the fact that this interrogatory was part of a large and complicated set of interrogatories directed to witness Abdirahman and it was unclear how much of the set should be redirected to the Postal Service.
